# Background to the data set

The texts in this data set were taken from a monograph on the now extinct Ka'biye variety of Arabic (Jastrow 2022), whose speakers fell victim to ethnic cleansings during the 1915 Armenian and Assyrian genocide. The texts were recorded by Jastrow in 1968 with surviving speakers in Diyarbakır (A, B) and Beirut (C, D).

The texts were annotated for WOWA by Paul Noorlander, with additional data handling work performed by Iuliia Berg.
